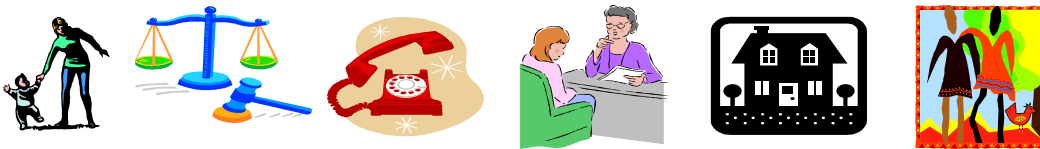


**2005 FY ANNUAL REPORT OF THE

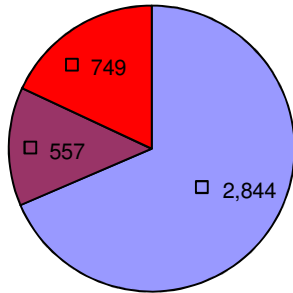

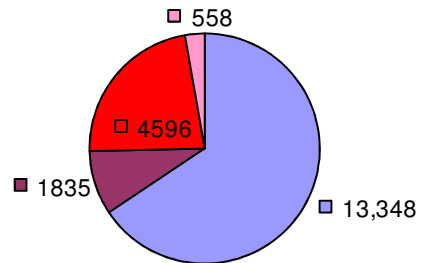

Summit County 2005 Primary Survivor Services

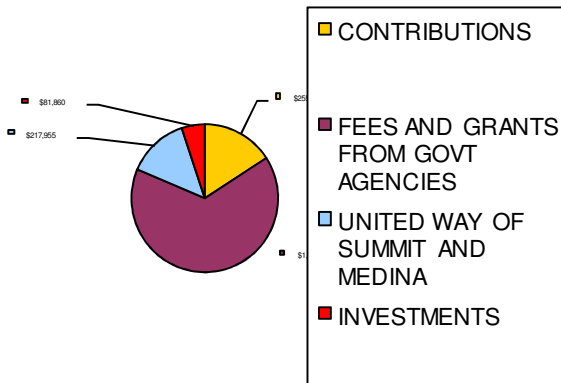

In addition to the above survivor services the Battered Women's seeks to prevent victimization through public awareness / education. In 2005 the Battered Women's Shelter spoke at over 298 events, with attendance topping 15,400 individuals.

The mission of the Battered Women's Shelter is:
 to provide emergency shelter and supportive services to victims of family violence and their children, who are in danger of physical, emotional and sexual abuse;
 to provide court advocacy services to those victims seeking to end family violence by using the rights and protection provided through the judicial system;
 to promote community awareness and sensitivity relative to the problems of domestic violence;
 to break the cycle of abuse through comprehensive quality crisis intervention services to all families living in a domestic violence life.
